~ Long Service Ribbon and Medal ~

The ad hoc Awards Committee of Central and Arctic submitted the following proposal for a Long Service Ribbon and Medal.

It was proposed and accepted that a Long Service Ribbon be awarded using the current criteria after 5 years of active “In Good Standing” Service to the CCGA. Each subsequent five years of service will have a clasp in the way of a Maple Leaf added to the Ribbon. At ten years a bronze Maple Leaf would be added, at fifteen years a silver Maple Leaf, at twenty years a gold Maple Leaf and at twenty five years a red and gold Maple Leaf as per examples on the right. No further clasps would be awarded after the final recognition of twenty five years when the Long Service Medal is awarded.

Members are allowed to wear the Long Service Medal, and appropriate service clasp, on formal occasions.

Members are encouraged to wear the ribbon, with the appropriate service clasp on working dress according to current Uniform Regulations. The Member’s service will then be recognized in a working environment.
